The Joust - Historical Solid Lance Tournament

In modern jousting, there are three types of joust you will typically see. Balsa Jousting, which is the most common in Australia, involves a solid lance 'handle' that has had the last metre or so removed and replaced with a frangible balsa tip. This is done for safety, though these lances still require huge amounts of force to break them, and they are fully capable of delivering big hits.

American Solids is the type you may have seen on shows like 'Full Metal Jousting' and involves a pine dowel instead of the balsa tipped lance. It is typically not practiced outside of the USA and will result in big hits and riders being unhorsed.

The last type is Historical Solid Lance jousting. This seeks to recreate the joust exactly as it would have been done in the 15th Century with full length thick pine lances and steel tips called 'coronels' designed to grab the shield or armour of the opponents. This type of jousting requires the highest quality reproduction armour, incredibly well-trained horses, and specialised types of helmets based on the type that was popular 500 years ago for this very reason!

Historical Solid Lance jousting has a long and storied history in Australia. The first historical solid tournament in modern times was hosted by Rod and Michelle Walker (of the Horse Lords) in 2011. Andrew McKinnon brought the style to the forefront of medieval events with the annual St Ives Tournament in Sydney



between 2014 and 2019 attracting the best jousts from all over the world, and also hosting the World Jousting Championships in 2016 and 2019. Unfortunately, the impact of COVID-19 on large events was felt particularly for this style of joust, which is quite expensive to run and thus tends to be tied to the largest events.

So we hope you understand when we say this year we are bringing you something truly special! Rodney Deaman has passionately pursued Historical Solids jousting since he started down his jousting path, and through his business "Riding With Sticks" is bringing you the only Historical Solid Lance Jousting Tournament in Australia this year and only the second since 2019!

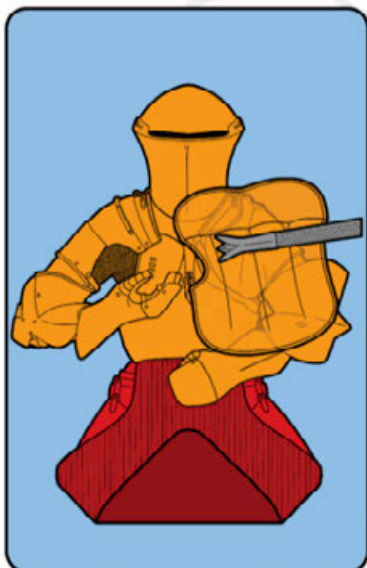
+5 POINTS WILL BE AWARDED FOR UNHORSEING YOUR OPPONENT WITH A GOOD AND LEGAL STRIKE.



+2 POINTS WILL BE AWARDED FOR A COMPOUND BREAK OR A SHATTER WITHIN THE **LEGAL TARGET ZONE**.



+1 POINT WILL BE AWARDED FOR A SIMPLE BREAK OF THE LANCE WITHIN THE **LEGAL TARGET ZONE**.



-2 POINTS FOR STRIKING ON THE **POMMEL OF THE SADDLE**, OR ON THE RIDER **BELOW THEIR WAIST**.

-2 POINTS FOR HITTING THE TILT WITH YOUR LANCE AT ANY TIME DURING YOUR COURSE.

-3 POINTS FOR HITTING THE TILT WITH YOUR LANCE, AFTER THE FIRST OCCASION AND ANY TIME THEREAFTER.

ANYONE WHO **STRIKES A HORSE** WITH THEIR LANCE SHALL BE ASKED TO RETIRE FROM THE FIELD, LEAVING THEIR OPPONENT WITH **2 POINTS** PER PASS NOT RUN.

NO POINTS WILL BE AWARDED FOR A LANCE THAT BREAKS AS A RESULT OF A SWIPE ACROSS THE OPPONENT'S BODY.

Meet the Jousters!



Sir Rodney is the Captain of the Company of the Hound and co-owner of Riding with Sticks. He has pursued jousting relentlessly for the past four years, competing in Tournaments across the country and winning the Orange Medieval Fair and Victorian Medieval Faire. Last year, Sir Rodney represented Australia in England at the Arundel International Joust Tournament and later the Lincoln

International Joust Tournament, leading Australia to victory and taking the individual title.

Sir Rodney has dreamed of competing in Historical Solid Lance tournaments since the beginning and has decided to make that dream a reality by bringing it to the Tarago Medieval Faire. Most recently, Rodney was inducted into the Order of the Star, an elite group of Australian Jousters, in recognition of his dedication to the sport, his diligence in approach and his continuous application of chivalry.

Lady Renae is a world-renowned jouser and fierce competitor. Jousting since 2019 under the guidance of her husband Sir Clifford, she has proven to be among the world's best. She is the first woman to ever win the Arundel International Jousting Tournament and is a former Australian Joust Champion. She was part of the Australian Team for the 'smashes tournament' in 2023 and 2025 and has jousted in the European Joust Championships, Norway and Canada. Lady Renae has also pursued historical solids for a number of years, competing at Tarago Historical Solid Lance Tournament in 2025.



Renae was also inducted into the Order of the Star alongside Sir Rodney, the first woman recognised by the prestigious group for her dedication and contributions to jousting in Australia.

Meet the Jousters!

Sir Hamish hails from Victoria, and is the student of Lady Renae and Sir Clifford Marisma. As the newest joust on the field, Hamish has been jousting for only 2 years, but has spent his life dedicating himself to the medieval reenactment scene.

As an accomplished ground fighter and rider, he was knighted into the Order of the Spur, and regularly competes in Victoria and South Australia.

Sir Hamish has been training hard to participate in this, his first Solid Lance joust, and has been fortunate enough to be able to borrow the armour of his mentor, Sir Clifford, as a suitable suit of armour often takes many years to curate.



Lady Liberty is our second local joust, and is not only the wife of Sir Rodney, but a truly accomplished rider, joust and horse archer! Having stood on the podium of most of the jousts she has competed in since starting her jousting career more than 5 years ago, Liberty has trained multiple horses in the tilt and helped many other riders pursue their equestrian combat dreams.

She is one of Australia's most decorated and highly ranked and accomplished horse archers and has represented Australia twice in recent years at the International Horse Archery Alliance's World Championships. Having ridden since she was a small child, Lady Liberty has competed in numerous horse sports, including dressage, show jumping, hacking, cross country, sporting and mounted games, and now focuses her ridden time on medieval equestrian sports. She has competed at the Abbey Medieval Festival's Tournament twice, and had the honour of marshalling the tournament last

year. She returns to the field in Tarago, Blacktown, Caboolture, Townsville and Ballarat this year for her first full competition season in more than 18 months. Tarago Medieval Faire will be her first Solid Lance Tournament, competing on her gorgeous Friesian cross horse, Dragonfly.

Rod and Michelle - Marshalls of the Joust

This year, we are honoured to have the Joust marshalled by the wonderful Rod and Michelle Walker. Both Rod and Michelle are famous in the jousting world, and were instrumental in the development of jousting as a modern sport, in Australia and internationally and organised the first Historical Solid Lance tournament in the world in 2010.

The role of Marshall is critical to ensuring that the competition is fair and consistent, but above all, safe, both our riders, the horses and our spectators. Marshalls have the final say in all things on the tournament field, can award points, deduct points, eliminate competitors and will ultimately have the final say on the outcome of the tournament.

Declan and Richard - Heralds of the Joust

A funny and fearsome duo graces our field this year in our heralding team, with Declan and Richard on field to walk you, talk you and entertain you through every single joust pass, literally blow by blow!

Declan is an upcoming herald, and found his voice in reenactment groups and events including the Call to Arms immersive historical encampment where his hilarious recount of the battles between Red and Gold entertained the masses. We are delighted to welcome Declan to the field to be the voice of our Joust this year, so make sure to give him a warm welcome!

Richard has been our wonderful herald at the Tarago Medieval Faire in recent years and is well known in the medieval communities as the voice of jousts and shows around the region, including Blacktown Medieval Faire, Berry Celtic Festival, Winterfest and Queanbeyan Medieval Faire. This year, he will under-herald Declan but rest assured, he'll be just as informative and funny as he always has been!

Riding With Sticks

Riding With Stick is a Tarago based riding school and equine entertainment business. Run by local family Rodney and Liberty Deaman and Jacqueline-Lee Dominick, RWS offers riding instruction in horse archery, skill at arms, classical dressage, general riding, confidence management and horse handling. Riding With Sticks brings you the Historical Solids Joust at this year's event in collaboration with Marisma Equine Entertainment.



The business also offers entertainment and displays with jousting, horse archery and many other live entertainment options possible, as well as advertising, shows and demonstrations. Check them out on Facebook or online, or find them around the Faire!

Marisma Equine Entertainment

Marisma Equine Entertainment is based in Snake Valley, Victoria and can provide horses and riders for a variety of shows and performances for live audiences, movies and short film work, tv ads, weddings and photoshoots.

School of Arms and Armour -

Australian Harnischfechten Championships 2026



2026 sees the first ever Australian Harnischfechten Championships come to life, hosted by the School of Arms and Armour. The Championships will see competitors from across Australia battle it out in 3 heats across the course of the day, before the toughest of them come together for the finals.

Harnischfechten sees competitors utilise weapons such as the long sword, dagger and pollaxe to try and surpass their opponent's armour and defensive techniques.

With a superb replica 16th century Aachen drinking glass adorned with bear heads donated by Midgard Designs and Tarago Medieval Faire, we are sure the fight for the title will be fierce! Make sure you catch all of the action at the Harnischfechten Area throughout the day -

Canberra Burly Griffins - Buhurt Fighting



Canberra's first Buhurt team is coming to the Tarago Medieval Faire! As one of the largest Buhurt groups in the region, the Burly Griffins will be providing a full day of entertainment as they battle it out in the Buhurt Arena!

Buhurt is a modern variation of medieval full-contact combat, with competitors donning steel armour and mail, and fighting with a wide variety of weapons and techniques including striking, wrestling, throws and trips. The fighting is commonly team based, and can feature anything from 5vs5 to over 100 a side, with competitors battling to be the last man, or woman, standing!

The Burly Griffins are based in Gungahlin and meet four times a week to train different fighting styles. Competitions are divided into weight classes and participants utilised a range of weapons including swords, staffs and axes. Make sure to check them out and grab more details on this awesome sport!

The Burly Griffins have scheduled fights in the Buhurt arena at 1030am, 1230pm and 230pm, and will be situated opposite the fight arena under the pine trees throughout the festival.

The Horse Lords - Horse Archery



The Horse Lords are a reenactment group based near Bathurst, NSW. Their founders, Rod and Michelle Walker have been instrumental in the reenactment scene in Australia, with a strong career in all three styles of jousting, both at home in Australia, and internationally.

Nowadays, they focus on the material culture, armoured foot combat, equestrian skills and the presentation of different mounted warriors and soldiers from throughout history.

This year, the Horse Lords will reenact the spectacle of Scythian Warriors taking on Greek hoplites in a very realistic demonstration of the type of combat that would have occurred thousands of times across history.

Horse archery is one of the most ancient forms of mounted combat. For as long as humans have ridden there is evidence to suggest they have carried bows and arrows for hunting and war, and there are dozens of times in history where nomadic archers from the great Eurasian Steppe have brought established empires in both Europe and Asia to their knees.

One of the earliest known cohesive groups of horse archer cultures were the Scythians. Occupying an area from roughly modern day Uzbekistan to Bulgaria, these nomadic warriors were famous for their love of colourful outfits, ceremonial use of gold and a certain plant they were quite fond of smoking.... But they weren't just out to be pretty! Famed and feared for their skill with the bow and razor-sharp swords, these nomadic warriors were the scourge of everyone from the ancient Greeks, Persians and even the early Chinese dynasties. It was Scythian horse archers who were said to have been the downfall of Cyrus the Great, founder of the Persian Empire!

The Horse Lords will be performing in the Main Arena at 1230pm.

Medieval Archery Society

The Medieval Archery Society (MAS) primarily portrays an English mercenary company in France circa 1365. The group is based in Sydney but participates in events around the state. While many members' main focus is archery, many members have skills in medieval cooking, leatherwork, spinning and textiles, blacksmithing, fletching and foot combat.



Come along and watch the power of the longbow and other weapons in the MAS demonstration and archery competition in the Main Arena, and make sure to check out their display and the archery range throughout the course of the festival.

Fechtschule Sankt Peter - 17th C Polish Sabre

Fechtschule Sankt Peter is a school of historical fencing based in Sydney, with foundations from 1998. FSP has been operating as a stand alone school since 2004, focussing on German longsword and Polish sabre.

As the Szlachta Sydnejski, they present displays of sabre fighting as it was done in the 17th Century by nobles of the great Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth.

You can see their display at 1130am in the Harneschfecten Arena.



Austr Hyski - Combat Through The Ages

Based on the Central Coast of NSW, Austr Hyski is a combined historical group, focusing on medieval reenactment and reproduction, combat skills and education.

This year, Austr Hyski will be presenting a demonstration of Combat Through The Ages, showing different styles of combat and weaponry from periods in history.

The group has created a wonderful welcoming space in the two years they have been operating, with now more than 30 members, and always willing to welcome new members.

Make sure you catch Combat Through The Ages in the Harnischfecten Arena at 1pm.



Company of the Hound

Company of the Hound is a 15th century reenactment group based in Tarago NSW, formed in the early 2020's as a branch of the long-standing Company of the Gryphon from Caboolture, QLD. Focusing on military life in Western Europe between 1450 and 1490, the group has a strong focus on equestrian pursuits including jousting, skill at arms and mounted melee, as well as armoured foot combat and re-enactment of day-to-day military life.

Company of the Hound will be on hand to arm the knights for the joust, and have a medieval display open throughout the day, showing some of the equipment required for reenactment, including clothing, weaponry, cooking and camping items, horse tack and jousting paraphernalia.

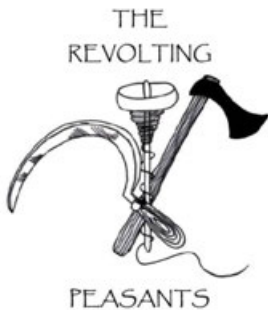


Company of the Errant Knight

This year, they will focus specifically on the Roman legions as it might have looked at the time of the invasion of Britain in the 1st century AD.

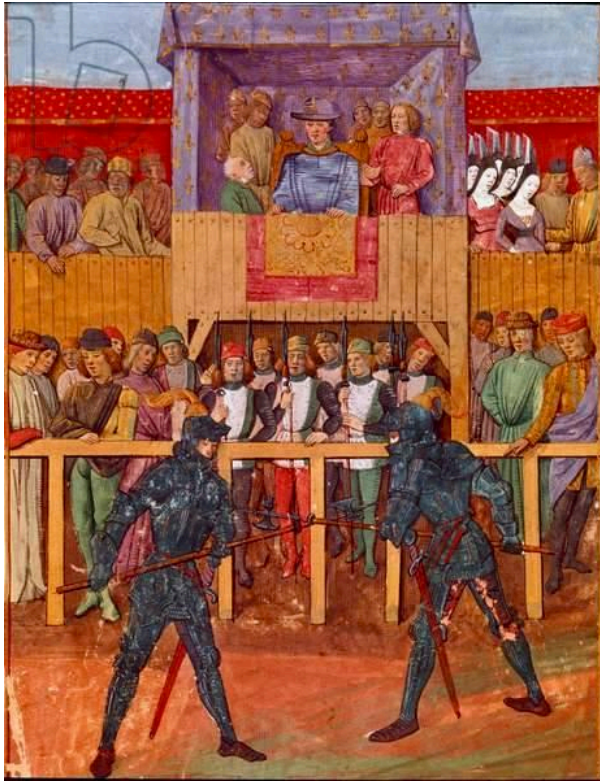
The Community Corner
